Exams: There will be three 50 minute midterm exams and a 2 hour final exam. There will be **no makeup exams**. A midterm exam will be excused only if a valid reason is given with documentation, beforehand if possible. Work schedules and vacations are NOT considered valid excuses.

Exam Rules: No calculators will be allowed for the exams. In addition, no electronic devices of any kind (phones, computers, tablets, MP3 players, etc.) will be allowed for exams (or during any time in class). No book, notes or papers can be used, scrap paper will be provided if necessary. Students should only bring a pen or pencil and eraser.

Any grading discrepancies on an exam should be brought up before the exam leaves the classroom. *Once a graded exam leaves the classroom, the grade can no longer be changed.*

Quizzes and Homework: All homework assignments will be done electronically through WebWork. There is a \$30 fee for using WebWork, which must be paid by June 7th. See <http://www.math.msu.edu/webwork/> for information on how to sign up and pay. Assignments will be due on Thursday nights. There will be three 20 minute quizzes given in class, one on each Friday which we do not have an exam. The rules for quizzes are the same as for exams.

Grading: There will be a total of 600 possible points for the course:

- 3 quizzes each worth 20 points
- Homework worth a total of 40 points
- 3 midterm exams each worth 100 points
- Final exam worth 200 points

Your final grade will be no worse than on the following scale:
